

## Detailed overview of sources of waste generation under section 3 (11) VerpackG

Section 3 (11) VerpackG (Packaging Act) lists examples of sources of waste generation that are comparable to private households. The packaging that typically accumulates as waste with these sources of waste generation is considered to be subject to system participation within the meaning of section 7 VerpackG, and is to be collected nationwide by **system operators**, separately to municipal waste collection, in line with section 14 VerpackG.

The list under section 3 (11) VerpackG is not exhaustive. The examples listed there are further clarified below to enable the sources of waste generation to be classified. This does not exclude other sources of waste generation that are not mentioned in the list from being classified as private final consumers. Agricultural holdings and craft enterprises whose plastic, metal and composite packaging and/or paper/paperboard/carboard is collected at the rate that is normally associated with private households and in waste bins that do not exceed 1,100 litres (so-called 'volume criterion') count as comparable sources of waste generation.

If a source of waste generation also exercises a retail function (e.g. petrol stations, jewellers, artisanal food production business), this part of the source of waste generation with a retail function is not to be considered as comparable. Packaging emptied in the course of exercising a retail function is transport packaging of trading goods, and is not considered to accumulate with comparable sources of waste generation.
